

INTRODUCING TELEMEDICINE!



Good News! [[Client Name]]'s plan will now cover telemedicine visits with your Meritain provider at the same cost to you as your in-person office visits. This applies to both primary care physicians and specialists.

The new telemedicine benefit through your medical plan offers coverage for visits with your specific provider. **This** benefit is only available to employees enrolled in one of our medical plans.

For example, if your provider is only scheduling virtual visits right now because of COVID-19, your plan will cover the appointment the same way as if you had an in-person visit.

[[Client Name]] will continue to offer the Teladoc program in addition to telemedicine visits with your provider. As a reminder, Teladoc is standalone telemedicine company that gives you access 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to their network of U.S. board-certified doctors through the convenience of phone, video or mobile app visits. You pay a \$20 copay per consultation.

Teladoc is available to all employees regardless of whether you are enrolled in a medical plan. Teladoc doctors can provide medical advice, treatment for non-emergency conditions, professional counseling for mental health issues, and more.
